with the Child development coordinator.

Core duties and responsibilities:

- > Support the development and provision of quality out of school services and the introduction of integrated initiatives, responsive to children and young people's needs within the context of their culture and community.
- > To support the Child youth development team to deliver planned schedule of activities for summer projects.
- ➤ Engage with children and young people and work to support the programmes for intervention particularly group activities and group work programmes as per the remit of the Family Hub support services.
- Focus on capacity building for children and young people to encourage them to shape and participate in the development of service design.
- > Support children and young people with additional needs and/or vulnerabilities in all service provision and programmes as part of the team.

- > To explore development of community based programmes in conjunction with the Child youth development team
- ➤ Engage in the ongoing development of links between supportive agencies.
- > Support the child youth development team in the development and review of policies and procedures and with the collection of data in line with reporting requirements.
- In collaboration with the child youth development team and the service manager, maintain all health and safety standards to ensure all reasonable measures to safeguard the health, safety and welfare of children attending the service are in place.
