Respond in Action, Phase 1 Dungloe, Co. Donegal

Respond are delighted to announce that we will be piloting a new initiative born out of our responses from you as our tenants.

A number of tenants identified that the lack of connectivity to technology to keep in touch with family, friends and Respond was an issue for them. Some of our older tenants asked if we could assist with this. This was particularly evident in more rural parts of the country where technologies such as broadband are not as widely available. You asked us for help, we listened. We made an application for funding from the RTE Comic Relief Fund for a project, Respond in Action; connecting with tenants and service users during Covid-19, starting in Donegal. This Pilot will enable our front line staff to provide a more personal and engaged outreach experience for our tenants and services users as we continue to live with the

restrictions of Covid-19. The aim of this pilot programme is to break the cycle for those who feel isolated and disconnected. This will enable person to person connection through the use of technology in user friendly way.

They were glad to help and provided us with plenty of food. We were able to cater Christmas dinner for those who wanted it. The dinners were plated up and with the help of a friend, the local Tenant Relations Officer delivered them on Christmas Eve.
